

## TO: SCOUT EXECUTIVE, CAMP DIRECTOR, AND APPLICANT

1. Fill out the application page in detail with applicant personally signing. The Scout Executive or camp director or both should assist the applicant. This will help the faculty insure that every individual receives the help needed in order to do the job in camp this summer. **Give applicant remainder of this brochure.** Councils are expected to fully brief "John Does" and those registered too late to receive confirmation material. See prior preparations below. **John Doe registrations are not encouraged.**
2. Complete section name and date of school for which applicant is enrolling.
3. Send application through your council office. The Scout executive must sign approval. **Persons hired who are primarily registered in another council must be approved by both councils.** Prior clearances from the council of primary registration should be attained prior to contact, interview and hiring.
4. Registration fee of \$75 must accompany application. This fee is not refundable, but may be transferred to a replacement student for the same school & section. Total fee due two weeks before school opens. **Applications with full (Not Discounted) fees received in region office 2 weeks prior to the School will receive a \$75 discount which may be reimbursed only if all criteria is met.**
5. Send all applications and fees to: Northeast Region-BSA, National Camping School, SUM 250, PO Box 152079, Irving, TX 75015-2079 (Phone: (972) 580-2000, Fax: (972) 580-2502).
6. Have applicant download the new Personal Health & Medical Record Form off the BSA websites ([http://scouting.org/filestore/pdf/34605\\_Letter.pdf](http://scouting.org/filestore/pdf/34605_Letter.pdf)) to have filled out by a physician and taken to the school. A **\$ 100** or more fee will be required for anyone without a current physical, and will be the responsibility of the council if not paid by the participant at the time physical is given at school. Only those who are physically fit and at least 18 years of age before the opening day of the school may participate.
7. Provide aquatics program applicant with diagram or sketch of the camp waterfront area(s). Aquatics and voyageur participants must have adequate (Preferably strong) swimming skills prior to attending, preferably BSA, ARC or YMCA Lifeguard which is a **must** for Aquatics Supervisors. (Voyageurs will need Lifeguard certification and 1<sup>st</sup> Aid Requirements prior to performing duties.)
8. Camp directors should bring a copy of their long-range plan, maintenance program, conservation plan, camp budget, plus such items as staff agreements, staff manuals, job descriptions, menus, etc.
9. Shooting sports graduates who desire to belong to NRA will be able to apply for membership and/or instructor certification while attending camp school. (NRA membership is not required for BSA certifications but is required for most NRA certification.)
10. Spaces in some schools/sections are limited - first-come, first-served. Persons not attending will forfeit total school fees. "John Does" not canceled or filled 2 weeks prior to the school **will have full fees billed to the council.** **Full payment for dropouts will also be required.** All cancellations are expected to be communicated to the region a minimum of 4 days prior to the school for partial fee credit.
11. Students are responsible for their own transportation to the camp school location. **All students are expected to arrive on time.** Nearest bus, train and/or plane locations will be provided in confirmations as well as a map to the camp. Housing (except at Heritage) will be in 7x9 wall tents on platforms in Boy Scout campsites. Students should be prepared for this type of camping.
12. Early arrival & late stay-over may incur additional costs for lodging and/or meals if earlier or later than 1 full day. Students are encouraged to arrive on Friday evenings (prior to Midnight) for the weeklong schools and Thursday evenings for the 2 weekend one.

These schools are offered to provide intensive training for your key staff members who in turn will have the responsibility for training and supervising other staff personnel or who serve in major positions in your council camping program. A different NCS application and brochure is available for Cub Scout Day Camp, Cub Scout Resident Program Director, and Family Camp Administration.

Note: Personal equipment, bedding, uniforms, etc., purchased for students at the camping school, and not paid for by the participant will be billed to the council. **Students will be expected to wear the complete field uniform for much of the week. All students are expected to live/sleep in camp unless prior arrangements are made with the Regional Program Director.**

**Certification-** A student must be 18 years of age, a BSA registered member and be present for the entire period to receive a NCS certificate. All students are expected to remain on camp property during the entire school including evenings.

**Prior Preparations:** (Councils must take the following steps with NCS Students prior to being sent to National Camping School):

1. Check references and approval. Have a written and signed contract.
2. Insure job assignment, title, and camp school section are clearly communicated and understood.
3. Communicate equipment, housing, and expectations of NCS (this is not a hotel) and for your camp.
4. Communicate timely arrival and departure details at camp school and for your camp. Students are expected to arrive on time.
5. Discuss uniform expectations, aims, methods, and ideals of the BSA. (Boy Scout and/or Cub Basic Training would be beneficial)
6. Insure Youth Protection training and Physicals are accomplished prior to the school.
7. Give participant acknowledgment/confirmation material in a timely manner if mailed/faxed to council instead of to participant.
8. Insure provisions made for uniforming. Uniform items may be pre-ordered and selected items will be available at the schools.

# NATIONAL CAMPING SCHOOL RESIDENT SECTION DESCRIPTIONS

<p><b>AQUATICS DIRECTOR (7)</b> - Directors of aquatics, swimming pool directors &amp; waterfront directors may attend this section that includes planning, operation &amp; administration of the aquatics program-waterfront protection methods-safe swimming in unit activities; basic instruction methods for swimming, lifesaving, boating &amp; canoeing, maintenance &amp; repair of aquatics gear. <b>Participants must have swimming &amp; lifesaving skills equivalent to Swimming &amp; Lifesaving merit badge &amp; be physically able to perform necessary skills, &amp; qualify for American Red Cross Basic First Aid which includes CPR by the BSA camp standards. Do not send those with weak swimming or other skills. This is a highly intensive physical course.</b> Not at Heritage. (Recertification at June Norcross Webster -June 11-13)</p>	<p><b>ECOLOGY/CONSERVATION (10)</b> - This course for directors includes training in planning &amp; developing ecology/ conservation programs: soil &amp; water conservation; forestry; fish &amp; wildlife management; nature trail construction; &amp; weather station operation. Opportunities for practice teaching included. They will also receive certification as Leave No Trace Trainers if qualified.  Not at Heritage or Resolute schools.</p>
<p><b>AQUATICS SUPERVISOR (8)</b> - A three-day course designed for certification of supervisors of Cub Scout day camp or resident camp aquatics. The prerequisite is BSA, YMCA or American Red Cross Lifeguard certification. This section includes administration of the Cub Scout aquatics program (recreational swimming &amp; basic learn-to-swim instruction).  Offered at Massawepie Friday, June 18-20 (See CS Resident Brochure for other Course at Camp Tuckahoe, June 4 - 6).</p>	<p><b>MANAGEMENT (1)</b> - For camp directors, assistants, &amp; business managers, of Cub Scout/Webelos resident camps, Boy Scout/Varsity Scout resident camps &amp; high adventure bases. Highlights include the methods of Scout camping, program resources &amp; management, staff recruiting, staff training, staff organization &amp; management, equipment &amp; supplies, health &amp; safety protection, commissary operation, maintenance of camp facilities, principles of camp planning, records &amp; bookkeeping &amp; trading post operations. Section not offered at Norcross Webster or Massawepie - Recertification at Resolute. (April 9 - 11)</p>
<p><b>CAMP HEALTH OFFICER (3)</b> - Includes American Red Cross 1st Responder course, plus health care practices for resident camp health officers. This section will meet the provisions of Resident Camp Standard #M34 for on-site Camp Health Officers in those states which accept this certification for camp health officers.  Offered only at the Resolute (Two week-end School) &amp; Norcross Webster Schools</p>	<p><b>OUTDOOR SKILLS/SCOUTCRAFT DIRECTOR (13)</b> - This course is designed for those who will direct the Scoutcraft areas in camp. It will involve an overnight experience. There will be skills instruction in knots &amp; lashings, fishing, orienteering, knife &amp; ax, cooking, camping, backpacking &amp; other topics. Persons taking this section should have some basic skills in these areas.  Not at Heritage or Resolute schools.</p>
<p><b>CHAPLAINCY (12)</b> - This course is for Camp Chaplains who are 21 years old, either ordained clerics or seminary students, or are individuals approved to serve as a camp chaplain (may or may not have other camp responsibilities) by the council religious relationships committee or Scout Executive. The chaplaincy course provides training, guidelines for a chaplain's ministry in camp, including worship services; relationship to youth, leaders; and camp staff; counseling; BSA religious policies; religious emblems program; and interfaith activities.  (Late Arrival for ordained clergy accepted) Section at Norcross Webster,</p>	<p><b>*PROGRAM DIRECTOR (2)</b> - For program directors of Boy Scout/Varsity Scout resident camps. This group will receive detailed information on building an effective program staff, coordinating the camp program, maintaining staff morale, counseling &amp; developing program staff teamwork &amp; staff training. Certificates from this course qualify the program director of a Boy Scout/Varsity Scout resident camp only. Recertification at Resolute (April 23-25).</p>
<p><b>CLIMBING/RAPPELLING (21)</b> - Designed for climbing supervisors who are empowered to train climbing and lead instructors at the council level. This section includes climbing, bouldering, Cub Scout Horizontal Walls, rappelling, anchor systems and belaying using either natural sites or constructed facilities. Good physical condition is recommended. At Resolute, Treasure Valley and Massawepie Schools</p>	<p><b>RANGER (14)</b> - Designed for camp rangers, property superintendents &amp; caretakers. Instruction includes modern maintenance management techniques for developing schedules, record keeping, and inventory &amp; budget control procedures at camp. A "how to" of plumbing, electrical, vehicle, refrigeration, boat &amp; tent repairs, pest control, pool, lake, road maintenance &amp; public relations with volunteers &amp; neighbors is also presented in this section.  Available at Heritage &amp; Resolute Schools. Recertification Section held only at Heritage school - February 20-23).</p>
<p><b>COMMISSIONER (6)</b> - For Boy Scout/Cub Scout resident camp. Specially tailored for camp commissioners who will serve assigned units to see that youth &amp; leaders have a positive summer camp experience. This course provides detailed information on help for units with scheduling, solving unit problems, interpreting camp policies, program planning, people management &amp; instilling team spirit &amp; enthusiasm. Not at Heritage school.</p>	<p><b>SHOOTING SPORTS (9)</b> - Designed for shooting sports directors &amp; rifle range officers of Cub Scout/Webelos Scout resident camps, Boy Scout/Varsity Scout resident camps &amp; high adventure camps. This section includes archery &amp; muzzle-loading rifle training, rifle &amp; shotgun instructor training conducted &amp; certified by a National Rifle Association instructor. Emphasis is on techniques for achieving the objectives of the Boy Scouts of America related to both Cub Scout/Webelos Scout resident camp &amp; to Boy Scout/Varsity Scout resident camp. Recertification at Resolute - April 9 - 11).</p>
<p><b>COPE (11)</b> - Designed for those who will be administrators, directors, or staff members of a COPE course. This section includes staff training &amp; course management. Actual participation in Project COPE events is included. Good physical condition is recommended.  Not at Heritage school. Recertification at Resolute - April 23 - 25.</p>	<p><b>VOYAGEUR/TREK LEADER TRAINING (22)</b> - (Available at the Massawepie &amp; Resolute schools) Prerequisite certifications required are: American Red Cross First Aid, BLS/CPR for the professional rescuer &amp; ARC, YMCA, or BSA Lifeguard. The course will include wilderness travel techniques, trek administration, low impact camping, canoeing, hiking &amp; also covers the requirements to be certified as a New York State Guide. Staff members leading treks off camp participate in this course.</p>
<p><b>RECERTIFICATIONS</b> - The region is offering recertification courses in six sections: <b>Management (15), Program Director, (16) Aquatics Director (17), COPE (20), Shooting Sports (18), &amp; Rangers (19)</b>. Recertification is for those people whose certification is about to expire or expired Dec 31, 2009. Persons not able to attend the recertification sections may attend the regular section full time to receive recertification as well.</p>	

**Special Courses: A Leave No Trace Masters Course will be held at the Resolute School. A section for 1st Year Camper Directors will be offered at the Resolute School and the Treasure Valley locations.**

\*NOTE: Program Directors serving both Cub Scout & Boy Scout Resident camps should attend both the Cub Scout Resident Program Director Section at the Cub Scout NCS and the Boy Scout Program Director Section at Resident NCS.

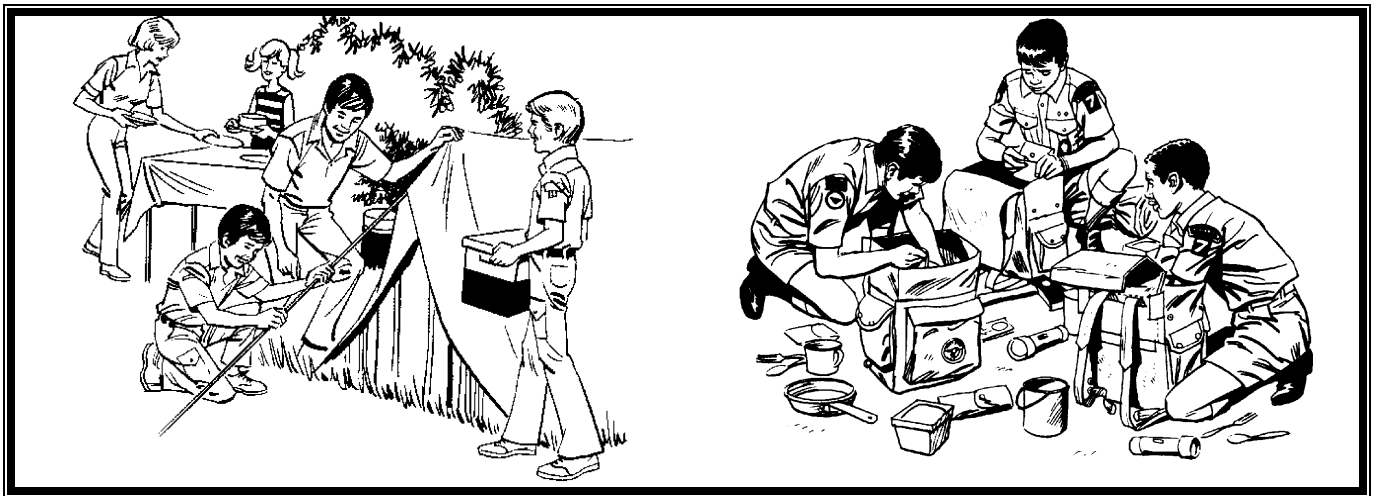
